#### Letter From Sarah Cottrill



Dear Friends,

Very few of us like change – but it is an inevitable part of life and can, if embraced with an open mind, bring unimagined benefits.

Twelve months ago, I was facing a time of highly significant change in my life. Moving from the house in which I was born, leaving friends, a job which, although not liked was at least familiar and "safe" and most importantly of all, taking on the role of an Ordained Minister, with all the challenges and learning which that involved. I was, to put it very mildly, apprehensive. A year later, I underwent another transition – from Deacon to Priest. This time I knew I was amongst friends with a strong body of support and an incredibly wise, kind and encouraging boss. Nonetheless, it was a daunting prospect – especially when one reads the part of the Ordination Service where the bishop describes the duties of a Priest!

Here on the West side of Worcester we are in a time of transition as we move towards becoming a team. Understandably, people are anxious about the effect it will have on "their church" and, also understandably, there is a tendency to focus on what are perceived to be the losses involved. Let me encourage you to re—think! At a wedding, the father of the bride often speaks of "Not losing a daughter, but (continued overleaf)

We are blessed, in St John's, St Clement's, St David's and St Michael's to have dedicated and generous Christians with a wide variety of gifts and many years of experience and faithful service. If all that experience and all those gifts are brought together just think what a forceful witness we could be for God as we reach out, in His name, to our wider communities. Just as, for me, the time of my Ordination was a time to reflect, to take stock of the past and to contemplate the future, so is this the time for our churches, individually and together, to do the same. Give thanks for the past. Feel some nostalgia, perhaps, for what is passing, but look forward, with confidence, with faith and with excitement, to what is to come. Change, I was told at college, is what happens to you, but transition is the process which brings it about – and it doesn't have to be negative! When I left Claines I was given a card, the wonderful message of which I share with you now:

God has great plans for you – and the best is yet to come!

The church was originally built in 1165 as 'The Chapel of St John' – the parish church then being St. Cuthbert's in Lower Wick. When the church of St Cuthbert's was demolished in 1370, St John's became the parish church.



#### PCC Meeting 24th June 2015

The Vicar chaired the meeting. 8 members were present. The strategic items were taken first.

In response to a report from the Buildings Vision Group (BVG), the PCC inspected the relevant areas and agreed to investigate further (a) the development of a "Welcome Area" by the main door (by removing two to four rows of pews in the South Aisle) and (b) the creation of a room in the gallery. The PCC also agreed unanimously that removal of all (or most of) the pews should be considered.

The PCC received reports on the three possible development projects identified at the February PCC meeting:

Youth and Family Worker: The Vicar highlighted key points: This is a Group project. The next step is to get funding for a feasibility study. The post would be mainly grant funded but the churches should pay something. We are not committing to anything yet.

House for Duty (HfD) priest: The PCC asked for the investigation timescale to be such that, if it were to go ahead, it would happen in about two years (i.e. around the time Sarah Cottrill will leave us). The PCC were content for the Diocese and other parishes in the West Worcester Group to be consulted. The PCC wanted to understand the process and obligations/expectations and see sample job descriptions.

Parish Hall: The Vicar reported that St Clement's are looking to convert their crypt into a substantial community space with a car park. The next stage is a feasibility study — is there a local demand for such a space and is it feasible to do it in the St Clement's church building? It was agreed to put on hold any further consideration of a Parish Hall for St John's church until the outcome of this feasibility study was available. We will revive our consideration if there is demand but it can't be met at St Clement's.

**Outreach and serving the community:** The PCC received written reports on Mission and Outreach, and from the Charity and Accommodation committees. Headline items from the reports and PCC discussions included:

- The Outreach Committee has come to the end of its brief. Outreach will be pursued through a Christian nurture course.
- The Charity Committee reported on the donations made so far this year (to Nepal relief fund, YMCA, Maggs Day centre, and emergency relief to local recipients). The committee had now agreed to contribute to a hardship fund for students of Christopher Whitehead (to help students who would otherwise struggle to meet the expense of buying books or attending interviews).
- The Accommodation Committee requested approval to deal with approximately two dozen cracked and missing panes of glass in the church windows. Likely cost is about £1,000. This was agreed. It was reported that the recent electrical work was

- completed at the contract price (no extras).
- The PCC agreed to seek a faculty for installation of a memorial bench in memory of Marjorie Share to be provided by her daughters Janice and Gail.

Children and Schools and Christian Nurture: The PCC approved various policies related to child protection and safeguarding, mostly based upon diocesan templates. The PCC received written reports on Christian Nurture, Children and Schools and Worship and Services. Headline items from the reports and PCC discussions included:

- The monthly Saturday children's sessions are going well with 10 to 30 children. The falling numbers at 10.30am on the second Sunday were noted. All were concerned and there was a discussion about this service.
- The Vicar highlighted that he saw the 'Pilgrim' course as very important.
- The Vicar presented a written report about aspects which need to be considered if
  we are to have a pattern of services across the Group which is sustainable with two
  priests. The Vicar will call a joint meeting of all the Group PCCs in October to
  discuss this further.

**Finance and Operations:** The PCC received a written report from the Standing Committee and a 2015 financial update. Headline items from the reports and PCC discussions included:

- The process to becoming a Team is a long and slow one. We are waiting for the Diocese to create a draft scheme.
- Fairer Share: The data collection exercise will run over 5th/12th/19th July. Data will be requested from "Active Members" based on a modified electoral roll.
- The 2015 finance figures show a small surplus for the projected 2015 outcome.

Under **Any Other Business** information was given about three future events: All Together (10/10/15), Skittles (26/6/15 with St Clements) and the Fun Day (11/7/15). The PCC sent thanks to the group of people organising the Fun Day.

The meeting closed with all saying 'The Grace'.





Ride+Stride is a sponsored bike ride or walk in which people from all over the country walk or cycle between churches, exploring and enjoying the countryside. The money they raise helps to preserve some of Britain's 47,000 churches, chapels and meeting houses which are at risk of falling into serious disrepair.

Supported by The National Churches Trust and in partnership with County Churches Trusts, Ride+Stride crosses 34 counties and opens the doors to some of Britain's most rare and unusual churches, chapels and meeting houses.

The event raises money through events and volunteers getting sponsorship to either cycle or walk from church to church. Their sponsorship money is shared between their local churches trust (in our case the Worcestershire & Dudley Historic Churches Trust) and the church of their choice.

St. John's Church received £10,000 from WDHCT in aid of the Tower Appeal and it would be good for us to give something back.

#### How did we do last year?

In 2014 there were 7 people taking part from the Group by either Riding or Striding. In total they raised £470.40, which meant that together £235.20 was raised for WDHCT and £235.20 came back to churches in the Group.

MY DEAR FRIENDS,
