Dear everyone

When we wrote last time, we wrote about new responsibilities. Life is certainly proving full as we attempt to keep up with things...

Penny left the Cathedral at midday on 31st Dec (Sunday) (yes, with cake). A few hours later she was in **Jesús el Nazareno**, at a special service to start the New Year with prayer; as expected, prayer was interrupted at midnight when the sound of fireworks became too intrusive. Despite warnings every year, it is still a common sight to see small children setting rockets off

During January the Diocese held a **Training Week** - obligatory sessions on Bible and Anglicanism in the mornings and workshops on Sunday School, youth work, music ministry, & AMA in the afternoons / evenings. Sadly, a large number didn't arrive: a heavy earth tremor near Arequipa and landslides on the road from Huancayo affected travelling. Penny led the Sunday School course; many churches do not have a children's ministry and she has now been named responsible for encouraging this important area of the Church's life.

Children's work in Jesús el Nazareno included a Bible Club "Jesus

came to my house"; just as well that God knew better when we said "3 groups of up to 20" since space available is just not large enough... Some opening activities each day were held in the street; conveniently bars at each end of the street - to prevent burglaries – also provide an enclosed



area for children. Neighbours were thus treated to daily renderings of "Head, shoulders, knees and toes" (English lesson). Particularly encouraging was the number of children who came from the "invasions", 10 minutes' walk from Church. Sunday School is now mornings (not afternoon); plans are to have a monthly service at this time and to invite parents (only ONE of whom currently comes to Church) Please pray for teachers Diana and Palmira, and for Yeni, Alexandra & Jennifer (helped in the summer and have expressed interest in continuing to be involved.)

A Youth Alpha course for 18-30 year olds began in March; they recently



held their retreat. Those in charge of the course are some young people from Jesús el Nazareno, but they have received great support from Chris and Hannah Agnew, volunteers here until July. Two of the girls – Melany and Karla – have been invited to attend a Youth Alpha Conference in Mexico City in June, a big challenge for them since they are both quite young.

Meanwhile, normal weekly activities continue. Juan Carlos, as Vicar General, is attempting to "regularize" paperwork for some of the **Diocesan properties**, beginning in the south of Lima where we work. Not easy – some things CAN be solved (eg a Church address being "Road" on one document and "street" on another); others are far more complicated, involving agreements made many years ago but never properly formalized.....

Once a month each Pastoral region has a meeting. In the South/East

Lima these are varied. Most include "business", eg matters such as the abovementioned paperwork, but we have recently been discussing the **Diocesan canons** which are being completely revised. This will be discussed at the Synod, on 20 & 21 April, but work will continue to



be done over the next year. Please pray for the Synod, especially in discussions where there are likely to be differences of opinion. At other meetings there have been presentations of materials by SU etc.

Penny will not actually be at the Synod. In Dec 3 of us from **AMA** went to N Argentina to take part in the "replica" (repeat) of last Sept's Mother's Union conference; now there is a follow up session to the Sept conference, in Canada. The project for children with fragile heath conditions (INES) has asked us as AMA to work towards protection of children from domestic abuse, starting with identifying factors for a /warning" symbol.

Juan Carlos also travelled! In January he accompanied some of the



boxes for the **Christmas Box project**. One place near Cuzco certainly comes into "extreme poverty" category; encouragingly this year some representatives from the school that gives most of the boxes were able to attend the final event, a presentation of the project (plus accounts etc), and

they also were interested in this area so please pray for any developments.

The children? Becky has applied to study for an MSc (she has a BA but apparently sustainability is an MSc) in the UK; Lizi is looking for a permanent job; and Jonny is studying.
